COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT 2026**

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT on May 11th, 2026, at 7:15 PM, or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard, a Public Hearing will be held before the Town Board of the Town of Deerpark, New York at the Town Hall, located at 420 Route 209, Huguenot, New York 12746, inviting public comments and suggestions regarding projects to be considered for Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funding under the Orange County Office of Community Development's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Entitlement Program. Under the CDBG program a variety of projects, including, but not limited to, those listed below can potentially be eligible for funding:

1. Acquisition and Disposition of Real Property
2. Public Works, Public Facilities or Site Improvements
3. Code Enforcement (Health Codes)
4. Clearance, Demolition and Rehabilitation for Public Use
5. Special Projects for Elderly and Handicapped
6. Provision of Public Services (Shelters, Clinics, Senior Nutrition, etc.)
7. Payment of Non-Federal Shares of Other Grant Programs

The Town of Deerpark will be considering projects to be submitted to the Orange County Community Development Office's CDBG Entitlement Program. The deadline for which is Friday, June 12th, 2026

Report for the month of April 2026

1. CALLS FOR SERVICE

- **Calls for Service**

2. MISCELLANIOUS

- Chief and Deputy Chief took part in a tabletop active shooter tabletop discussion at the Middle School
- Both of our Child Seat Technicians attended training/recertification class
- Chief met with officials from the Schoolbus Safety Team from Orange County to go over the program
- The Department received information on a "Street Takeover" at the Hawk's Nest that was slated to take place on April 25th. Due to the weather it was postponed until May 2nd. As the lead agency we developed a plan to respond to the takeover with the State Police, Sheriff's Department, and Port Jervis PD. The plan was implemented on May 2nd. Approximately 50 UTTs were issued to approximately 30 cars.

April 2026 Monthly Report

For the month, members were called in (3) times for trees down across the roadway.

All of our trucks were pressure washed and fluid filmed for the summer. This will be completed again in the fall just prior to being outfitted for winter.

Brush cutting was completed on the 284 roads. We've transitioned to ditching, hammering rock, and using our paver for shimming.

We were notified that we received the UDC grant again this year in the amount of \$4318.43. This will cover all of our expenses for (3) cleans ups; one commencing around Memorial Day, one around July 4th, and the last around Labor Day.

Some of the parts arrived for the playgrounds. A new panel was installed at HSP, basketball rims with new nets at the PD and Sparrowbush parks, regular swings and the Jenn swing was repaired at Sparrowbush Park. The new piece for the slide is supposed to be shipping out May 13th. As soon as it arrives, we will install it and re-open the Sparrowbush playground.

We replaced the mulch at the entire HSP playground and swing set area, the swing set at Sparrowbush and PD, and entire Bigger Park area. The playground at Sparrowbush will be completed once the new parts are installed.

We began mowing the parks the 2nd week of April. They will be mowed weekly or as needed weather dependent. I filled one of my part time seasonal positions and will likely fill the other one once school is out.

Based on a reception issue we experienced this winter and complaints from my employees, I began looking into other radio vendors. After some investigation, testing, and negotiation, I switched to Goosetown Communications. They have a digital system similar to what the PD uses which provides us with 100% radio coverage throughout the town. They also offered a GPS option so each truck is now outfitted with a GPS device. The total cost was about \$1300 more per year than what we were previously paying with no GPS and no reception in Rio. They began installing their equipment in March and finished this month.
